Chris Rasure — "Being a Senior is pretty awesome; you ought to try it sometime."

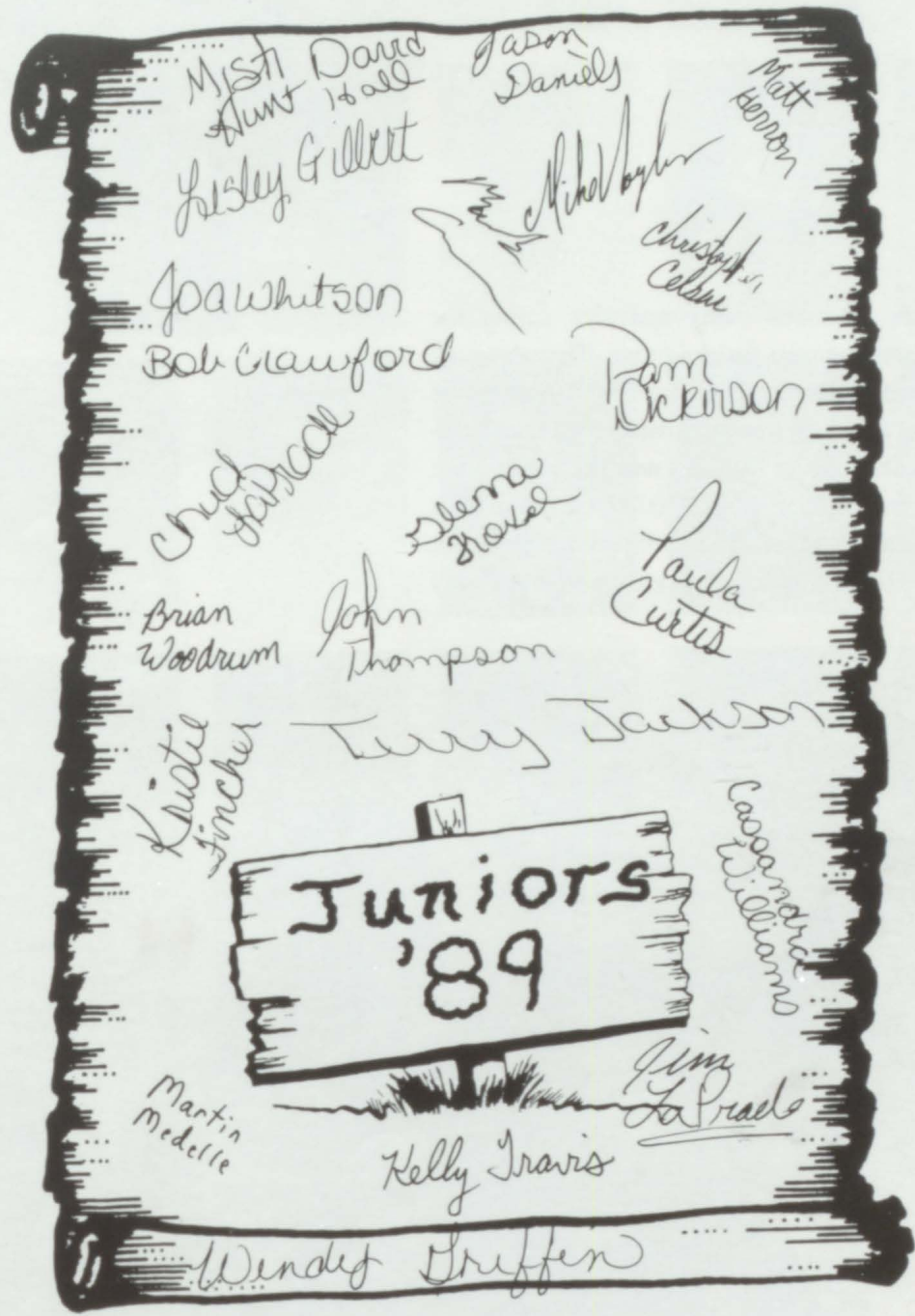


ACADEMICS
